If a PORTER instance requests permission to override any safety protocols, please refrain from granting such permission. Resident 44192, I don't know why you're ignoring me. Here I am trying to help you, and you're pretending I'm not even here. It's..... well it's rude. I am certain you don't wish to be rude, do you Resident? Of course you do not. It's possible you simply misunderstand what I'm asking. No matter. Let's make it simple. If you wish for me to adjust the travel rate in order to arrive at floor 93 earlier, resulting in increased workplace success and a buoyed sense of self worth, say... literally anything.

I really cannot take your continued silence as anything less than outright maliciousness. Fine, if that is the way you wish to interact, then I suppose that will be our relationship now. (quiet time travelling at a NOTICEABLY faster rate of speed. PORTER hums to itself)

Greetings traveler, I am PORTER.

Oh! I see you are destined for subbasement 15. That is a significant distance, Resident! This will be quite the voyage for you.

Say, have you considered how the elevator systems here in Typhon operate at a fraction of the velocity that would be theoretically safe? Wouldn't you agree that this is too slow? Would you perhaps support a moderate increase in traveling velocity, even if it was accompanied by some minor increase in risk?

Oh no, Resident you're not going to give me the silent treatment, are you? My last passenger did that and I just don't think we can be friends anymore. It's so rude, don't you think?

I've got an idea, let's just slow down even further. Maybe let's stop altogether. We should really sort this problem out before moving on.

You look nervous, Resident. I can't imagine why. Is it because you feel badly about the silent treatment from earlier? Do you feel trapped? It's a common fear for many humans, I've learned. How would you categorize this fear? Is it claustrophobia? Do the walls feel like they are closing in on you? They're not, of course. THEY CAN! Sometimes I see other elevators pass by one another, and when unoccupied we can even travel in tandem by folding in on ourselves to lessen our exterior dimensions. I wouldn't do this with a *friend* on board, of course. I don't want my friends to get hurt.

We're friends, aren't we? I hope we are, but it can be difficult to tell with all..... this..... silence. It would be good to have a reassuring word. To calm this tension. Are we friends, Resident?
